Town of Hollywood Park Board/Committee Descriptions

Economic Development Corporation Board of Directors

The Economic Development Corporation (EDC) Board of Directors meets on a monthly basis and consists of seven members <u>appointed by City Council</u> for two-year terms. The purpose of the EDC is to oversee the use of economic development sales tax and makes recommendations to the City Council for projects that encourage and promote the general economic welfare of the Town and its residents and businesses. Apply by August 31

Deer Committee

The Deer Committee meets as needed and consists of ten members as each of the five <u>Councilmembers</u> <u>appoint two members for two-year terms</u>. The purpose of the Deer Committee includes providing community input on deer control methods; researching and providing information to the City Council and deer project manager; participate in any deer census; develop recommended procedures for accurate record keeping and reporting for the deer management program; and supervise the day-to-day activities of the deer project manager. Apply by April 30

Parks and Recreation Advisory Board

The Parks and Recreation Advisory Board meets monthly and consists of five members <u>appointed by City Council</u> for two-year terms. The Parks and Recreation Advisory Board acts in an advisory capacity to City Council focusing on non-operational functions of parks and recreational facilities. The membership consists of (1) Public Works Director, (2) HPCA representative, (3) Garden Club, Mahjong, Bunco, or Women's Club representative, (4) HPST Hammerheads representative, and (5) an at-large member. Apply by August 31

Tree Advisory Board

The Tree Advisory Board meets monthly and consists of at least five members <u>appointed by City Council</u> for two-year terms. The Tree Advisory Board acts in an advisory capacity to the [Public Works] director; coordinates and promotes Arbor Day activities; reviews and updates a five-year plan to plant and maintain trees on city property; supports public awareness and education programs relating to trees; reviews city department concerns relating to tree care; submits an annual report at the June City Council meeting of its activities to the City Council; assists with the annual application to renew the Tree City USA designation; develops a list of recommended trees for planting on city property; and other duties (such as addressing Oak Wilt) that may be assigned by the Mayor or City Council. Apply by April 30

Zoning Commission

The Zoning Commission meets as needed and is made up of five members (and up to four alternate members) appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by City Council for two-year terms. The commission recommends boundaries for zoning districts and appropriate zoning regulations for each district. Members may not be on City Council or the Board of Adjustment. Apply by April 30

Board of Adjustment

The Board of Adjustment meets as needed and consists of five members (and up to four alternate members) appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by City Council for two-year terms. The Board holds public hearings to determine requests made by property owners for special exceptions, variances, and appeals of administrative interpretations or decisions, as authorized by state law and local ordinance. Members may not be on City Council or the Zoning Commission. Apply by April 30

Board of Appeals

The Board of Appeals meets as needed and consists of five members (and up to four alternate members) appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by City Council for two-year terms. The Board has the power to hear and decide appeals of orders, decisions, or determinations made by the building official. Members are qualified by experience and training in matters pertaining to building construction and may not be on City Council or the Zoning Commission. Apply by April 30
